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Charlie Hounchell was a well-rounded individual with a diverse range of experiences. He grew up in St. Petersburg as the son of a dentist. He attended George Washington University, Middlebury College (where he earned a master's degree in Spanish), and the University of Florida (where he earned his law degree). He also earned an MBA from an Arizona college

before returning to the Tampa Bay area to work as a prosecutor. In addition to his more cerebral pursuits, Charlie was a model in South America and Europe, known for his striking appearance and calm demeanor. Throughout his career, he owned a medical billing company, ran a law firm and title company, and sold real estate. Charlie was also actively involved in his community, serving on more than half a dozen nonprofit boards, two of which he chaired simultaneously. Despite his busy schedule, he always made new friends along the way. Charlie passed away suddenly in 2013, well before his time, but his love of the arts lives on through the scholarship program that he founded.

Charlie passionately supported Tampa Bay BCA and our nonprofit organization's mission to unite businesses in backing arts and culture. He was dedicated to inspiring and encouraging young student artists and performers. In 2008, Charlie spearheaded the establishment by Tampa Bay BCA of the Art Stars Scholarship program. Over 15 years, Tampa Bay BCA has awarded over 90 scholarships across six different fine and performing arts disciplines to students, predominantly from public schools, helping to offset tuition fees at prestigious colleges, universities, and conservatories across the nation. This enriching Tampa Bay BCA initiative offers some of the most gifted and deserving students in the Tampa Bay region life-changing opportunities, not only because of the crucial financial aid but also because it introduces them to celebrated judges and mentors in their respective fields, as well as a network of other talented and accomplished peers.

The Tampa Bay BCA Charlie Hounchell Art Stars Scholarship program is chaired by Stephen Gay, a long-standing member of the Tampa Bay BCA board of directors. Stephen leads Tampa Bay BCA in carrying forward Charlie's vision with passion and dedication. Today, together with all of you, we send a clear message to our youth — especially to our scholarship recipients.

She previously held the Neubauer Family Foundation Assistant Curator position at the Jewish Museum in New York City, where she worked for over 10 years. She received her M.A. in curatorial studies from the Center for Curatorial Studies at Bard College and earned a B.A. in art history and political science from the University of Washington.

Bondurant is a 20-year SAG/AFTRA actress and acting coach who was the first teacher hired at the Patel Conservatory in 2004. She brought her dynamic on-camera acting program to Tampa from Los Angeles and has her Meisner Acting certification, studying with mentor Larry Silverberg.

Eubanks recently returned to St. Petersburg City Theatre to musical direct its spring musicals *Jesus Christ Superstar* (2018) and *Pirates of Penzance* (2019), and she musically involved with the theater department at Eckerd College. She maintains a private vocal studio in St. Petersburg, is an active performer, and is Assistant Music and Worship Leader at the First Baptist Church of St. Pete.

Paul Wilborn is the Executive Director of the Palladium Theater at St. Petersburg College. Under his leadership, the Palladium has won numerous "Best of the Bay" awards and is recognized as the top venue for jazz, blues, choral music, chamber music, and dance in the Bay area. Paul is a pianist, musician, and bandleader. His American Songbook Series presents intimate cabaret shows at American Stage Theater

and other venues around Florida. As founder and leader of Paul Wilborn and the Pop Tarts, he played most major venues in the Tampa Bay area for 15 years. He is a founding member of the WMNF and Studio at 620 Radio Theater Project and contributes radio plays to the project. Wilborn serves as an adjudicator for a number of music competitions. Previously, Wilborn worked for Tampa Mayor Pam Iorio as Manager of Creative Industries, including directing Arte 2007, Tampa Bay's Festival of Latin American Arts.
